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






Board Organizational Chart












Interior Improvement Highlights
 Wiring to furnaces in main hall were temporarily reconfigured to fix issue with controls
 HVAC systems in facility were assessed
 Blu-Ray player & sound system installed in loft
 Kitchen circuits upgraded and diagnosed
 Kitchen roll shutters repaired
 Sub-divided basement storage room into three separate rooms
 Updated occupancy rating classifications

 - Rooms were re-painted, floors were stripped and polished
 - □Windows and wells were cleaned inside & out

 - **EFCL** Workshop was attended
 - Agreement has been reviewed and getting revised

- City of Edmonton Community League Operating Grant
 - □ Money delayed to November 2011
- Biannual casino event is coming up at Baccarat in May 2012
 - □ We will need volunteers

Year in Review – Membership

- Processed memberships both from online submissions and through Administrator
- Co-ordinated volunteers for BQCL events
- Membership year runs from September 1 to August 31 in alignment with EFCL
- In 2010/11, we had 285 BQCL members (increase from previous year with 268)

□ 7 senior, 15 singles, 263 families

The next wave of memberships will come from soccer registration in spring and tennis in summer

- Memberships can be purchased:
 - In person at community registration times No extra fees are charged
 - □ Print off PDF from BQCL web site & mail in with cheque
 - Online from EFCL (<u>www.efcl.org</u>), but service fees will apply
- More memberships are coming through electronically either from EFCL or BQCL web sites
- We are working on developing our own online payment system (e.g. Paypal)
- EFCL is also working on a system that would allow online payment & immediate card distribution

- Outdoor soccer:
 - □ Season April to July 2011
 - □ Mighty Mites 2 teams (17 players)
 - □ U6 7 teams (39 players)
 - □ U8 3 teams (33 players)
 - □ U10 1 girls and 1 boys (27 players)
 - U12 1 girls and 1 boys team. The boys team was a Sting development team. (27 players)
 - U14 1 boys team (16 players)
 - □ U16 1 boys team (19 players)
 - □ U18 1 girls team (18 players)



- 28 coaches and assistant coaches some were involved with coaching more than one team
- 15 were returning coaches from previous seasons.
- 35 players were transferred from Blue Quill to other communities
 - □ Majority in U12 (boys), U14 and U16 (girls)
 - Did not have enough players/coaches to form a team
- We also accepted players from surrounding communities to fill our teams
- We had 196 players wearing the Blue Quill soccer uniforms this past outdoor soccer season



- Indoor soccer:
 - □ Season Sept 2010 to March 2011
 - Blue Quill had 2 teams
 - □ 1 U6 mixed team
 - □ 1 U18 girls team
- Indoor soccer:
 - □ Season Sept 2011 to March 2012
 - Blue Quill has 5 teams
 - Approximately 60 kids registered.

- Revise the Mighty Mite program with the assistance of Perrin Beatty
- Recruit a team of volunteers to run a sustainable program. We have been working on this year to year, but still need a few more bodies
- Order coaches' t-shirts so they can be easily identified at the games. This is especially important at the U6 and U8 levels
