

- Develop and enhance relationships with organizations that serve LGBTQ people.
- Develop relationships with LGBTQ people within Community Leagues.
- Identify barriers to LGBTQ participation with Community Leagues.
- Increase participation of LGBTQ people in the community league events.
- Support Leagues to Increase participation of Community League members in LGBTQ events.
